




Speed split for this technology type










...Average UK measured broadband speed





Standard & Superfast Broadband Availability





Average speed of connections...




Regional UK Broadband Speeds



AUG 2000 Consumer 0.5 Mbps ADSL services launched. Freeserve launches at £150 /setup + £39.99/month. [Read more](#)

NOV 2004 BT Wholesale starts consumer IPStream Home 2000 (self-install 2 Mbps) trial. [Read more](#)

MAR 2006 BT Wholesale launches its up to 8 Mbps Max and Max Premium (rate-adaptive ADSL) products. [Read more](#)

SEP 2007 3 million unbundled lines in the UK. [Read more](#)

DEC 2008 Virgin Media launches 50 Mbps broadband service. [Read more](#)

MAY 2010 BT announces 'two thirds' of UK will get FTTC/ FTTP fibre by 2015. [Read more](#)

OCT 2010 Virgin Media announces 100 Mbps service. [Read more](#)

FEB 2012 Openreach announces FTTP on Demand for areas with FTTC to rollout in 2013. [Read more](#)
